- 1. Ultra Rugged** – There simply is not a tougher handheld computer out there. The Trimble Ranger™ meets stringent military standards (MIL-STD-810F) for drops, and it operates in temperature extremes from -22F to 140° F (-30 to 60° C). It's also fully weatherproof, with an IP67 rating, making it impervious to water & dust. You can work in the rain, drop the Ranger in the mud, or keep working in very hot or cold temperatures. The sturdy Ranger won't back down from the environmental challenge!
- 2. Long-life battery** – You need a rugged handheld computer that gives you a full day's work. The Ranger provides 30 hours of normal operation with the rechargeable battery pack.
- 3. Versatility** – Two separate CompactFlash (CF) slots and a Secure Digital (SD) slot let you add memory, additional wireless communication, GPS and more, providing options for collecting and transferring your data. An optional Extended CF-Cap™ keeps larger cards protected to the same rugged standards. All Trimble Rangers come with serial and USB ports, two stylus pens, a hand strap and screen protectors as standard equipment.
- 4. Two models** – The Trimble Ranger comes in two models. Select the one that works best for your application: the economical 300X model or the powerful 500X model. Both models have an Intel XScale processor, 53-keys and separate navigation, alpha and numeric keypad, plus an 8+1 directional pad. Other highlights include:
 - The Ranger 300X has 64 MB of SDRAM and 256 MB of on-board Flash. Integrated Bluetooth and 802.11g are optional, or simply use CF cards in the slots.
 - The robust Ranger 500X offers built-in Bluetooth and optional 802.11g, with 128 MB SDRAM and 512 MB Flash.
- 5. Windows Mobile** – Using the industry-standard operating system means compatibility with your work-related software applications. With Windows Mobile®, truly one size fits all. You have access to Mobile versions of Word, Excel, Outlook, PowerPoint and Internet Explorer – all on the same handheld computer that you use for your workload.
- 6. Sunlight-readable display** – The Ranger has a bright and clear color TFT touchscreen with a backlight. You can work with the Ranger outdoors on the sunniest day and still easily see what's on the screen; or view the screen clearly under low light conditions.

7. Integrated – The Ranger gives you the option of integrated Bluetooth and 802.11g. Stay connected without bulky wires or cables.

8. Data Security – To keep your data secure, the Ranger has persistent storage with the Windows Mobile 5.0 operating system and also has plenty of nonvolatile Flash storage space. As with any computer system, Trimble recommends that you copy your data to removable media or a desktop PC regularly.

9. Proven – The next-generation Ranger is one reliable data collector. The original Ranger proved itself in the field by people just like you who put it to the test every day. Built upon this strong foundation, the new Ranger is just as tough as its predecessor, with more power and state-of-the-art technology to meet your requirements.

10. Warranty – All Trimble Rangers are guaranteed. Even when the one-year warranty expires, Trimble offers a second and third year extended warranty options. You can purchase extended warranty coverage anytime during your first year of ownership, while your Ranger is under its original warranty. The cost of a year of extended warranty is equal to one service charge.
